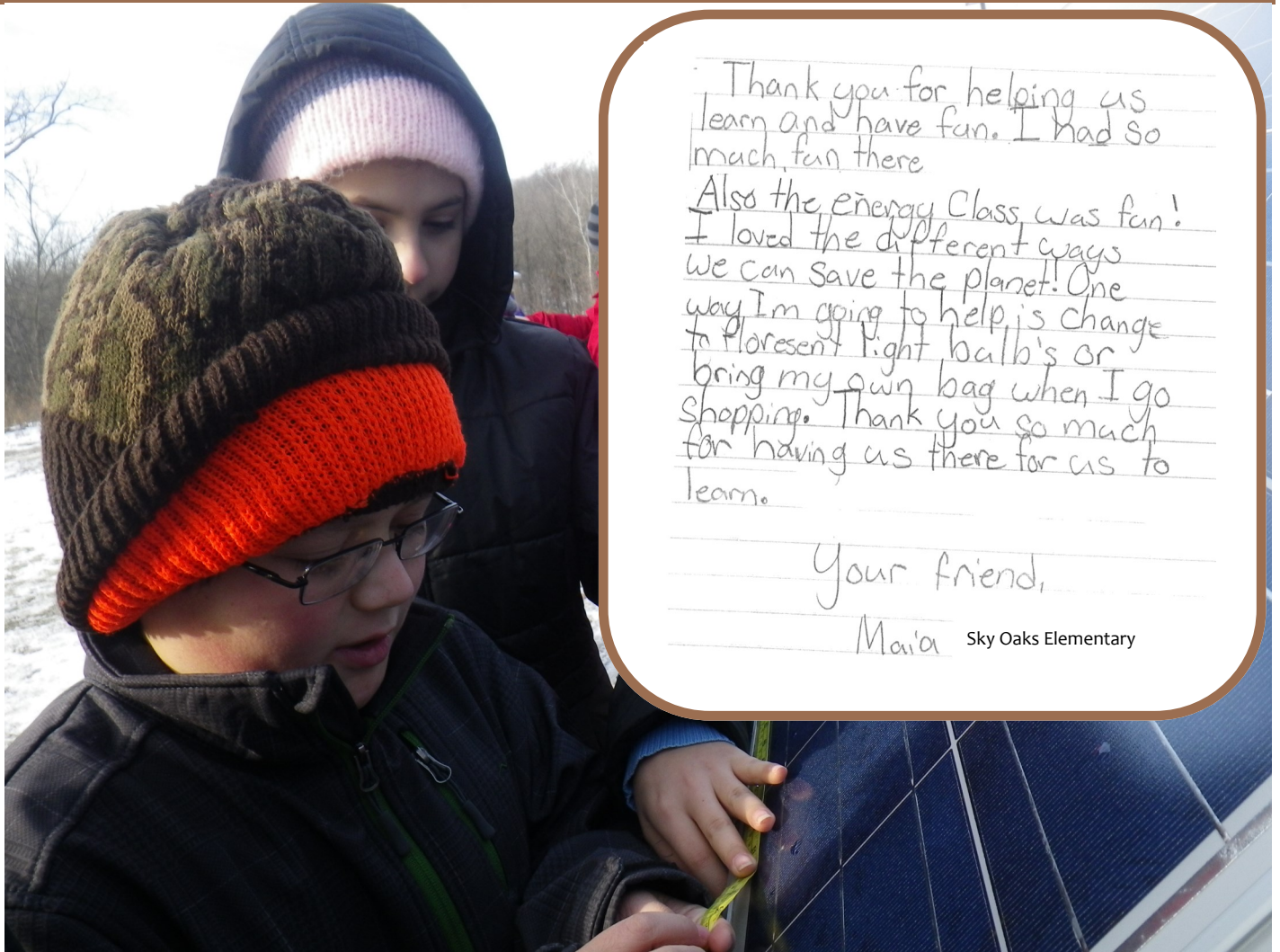

New Class: You continue to enrich our students learning



Our newest class, “**Inside Energy**”, helps students explore alternative energy sources. Students learn about our current energy source—coal—and discuss its limitations. Then they explore alternative energy sources at Eagle Bluff. They consider which sources are most effective and least problematic for a sustainable future. Finally, they present their energy recommendations for Eagle Bluff and Minnesota.

As these plans may take a while to implement, students learn what actions they can take today. They leave class understanding how daily decisions can impact their future and how wise choices can make a difference.

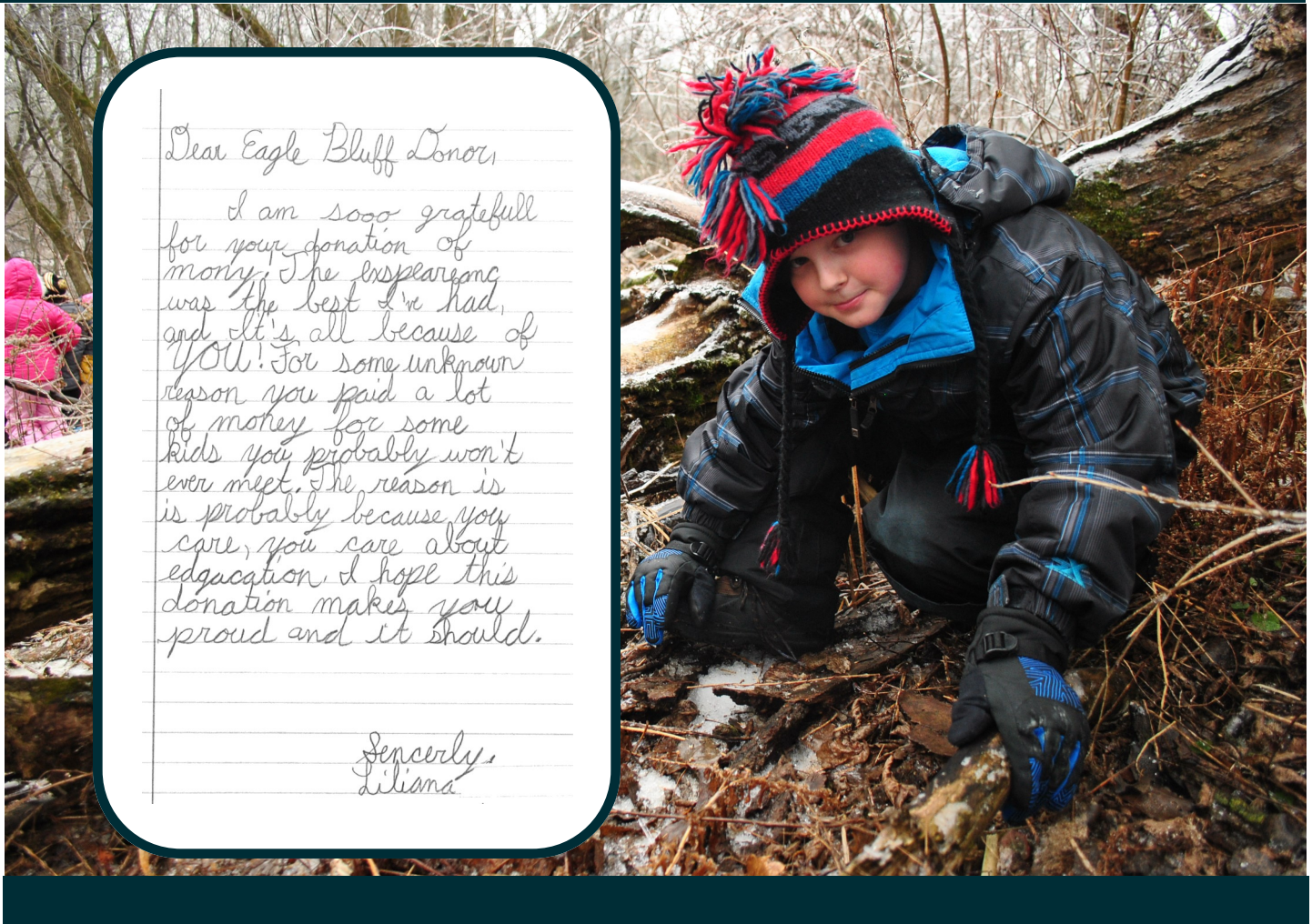


Meeting the needs of our students & communities
